If your child has been home with flu symptoms please keep your child home for at least 24 hours AFTER the fever breaks (and that is without the use of Tylenol or ibuprofen to reduce the fever). If your child has been vomiting, wait 24 hours after the last time he/she vomited before sending them to school. This flu has been lasting a rather long time for children. Just when you think they are getting better the fever seems to return. Also, the headache and body aches have been quite strong.

To all of you with children that have been home ill these past 2 weeks, we appreciate that you have kept them home until they are fully recovered. We have had very few relapse because you are taking extra care by not to send kids back too soon.

MEASLES

As most of you have heard by now there is a high concern about the Measles in our State. Measles is a serious disease that is VERY contagious. Please contact the school nurse or clinic if you are unsure if your child is up to date on their measles vaccinations.



The best way to protect your family from the Measles, according to the Public Health Department, is to get the vaccination. Doctors recommend that all children get the MMR shot and adults should get one if they did not receive it as a child. Getting the MMR vaccine is safer than getting the measles.
