Friday November 23. *Happy Thanksgiving*

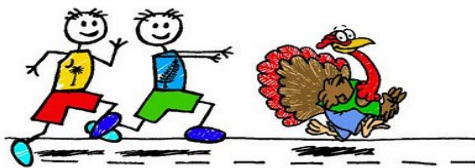

Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit

This week, our K-12 School Counselor Jeanna Carter started delivering the School Counseling Curriculum Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit to Ms. Kendra's second grade class and will soon start working with the rest of the Elementary classrooms. A Homelink newsletter will be shared with families to support the curriculum at home.

In the Bullying Prevention Unit lessons, students learn:

1. How to recognize bullying and that bullying is mean or hurtful behavior that keeps happening
2. To identify caring adults to talk to about bullying and use assertiveness skills to report it
3. That they can use assertiveness skills to refuse to let bullying happen to themselves and others
4. And that bystanders have the power to stop bullying by including others, standing up for them, and reporting bullying when they see it happen
